

Everett Morton Angier

Everett Morton Angier was born in Lexington, Mass., on December 1, 1851, and came to Florida in his young manhood.

On May 19, 1892, he was married to Addie V. Causey, only daughter of Mr. Daniel Causey, of Georgetown, and all his subsequent life was spent at Georgetown. For a number of years he engaged in farming, but later went into the mercantile business, which he conducted in a most able and satisfactory manner up to the time his health failed so that he was compelled to relinquish the active conduct of business, tho' it continued under his name under the guidance of his daughter.

Mr. Angier was one of a family of five, and the last to hear the Master's voice calling him to that blessed shore where all pain and weariness cease.

There are left to mourn him, his widow, Mrs. Addie V. Angier, and one daughter, Mrs. Esther Hiscock. Also a grandson, Russell Hiscock, all of Georgetown, and one niece, Mrs. Nellie Wheeler, of Medford, Mass.

But his friends and neighbors who will long bear him in memory are unnumbered. But we cannot grieve, for The Master and "Come" and he only obeys.
