### **Glenna E. Armev**

Glenna Evangeline Armev was born on March 5, 1927, and went home to heaven April 21, 2005. She was preceded in death by her parents, Richard and Myrtle (Lee) Plasterer and one great-grandson, Zachary Arnett.

Her loving husband of 56 years, the Rev. Dr. Willard J. Glenna was a minister's wife for more than 20 years. (To borrow a line from Charles Ludwig, "Mama was a missionary.") Young children were her special calling. After Mr. and Mrs. Armev retired from regular pastoral duties and moved to Florida, she continued to be very active teaching and working with the children of the church. She was also employed fulltime as a house parent, working with disabled/retarded adults at what was then Sunland Training Center at Gainesville, Fla.

Later, Glenna was diagnosed with Parkinson's disease, but continued to work fulltime until retirement age. She loved and missed "her boys" and fellow workers. But even then, she continued her work in the church until the natural progression of her disease made it impossible for her.

Glenna was a quiet encouragement and inspiration to everyone who knew her. She knew she wasn't perfect, but just included herself in an active prayer life that uplifted and preserved so many of us. Her last years were a real burden to her and she really longed to go on home to be with the Lord. We tried our best to encourage her, teaching her grandchildren and great-grandchildren the unconditional love she had shown us, and that we tried our best to return to her.

Glenna went home to be with our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ on April 21 at 1:45 p.m. We rejoice in the Lord and bless his holy name.

A memorial service in her honor will be held at the Florahome Church of God, State Road 100, in Florahome May 15 at 10:30 a.m. A dinner on the grounds will follow the service. All friends and family are welcome.
