**21 April 1911** Death of **Mrs. Emma (Emily A.) Vause Flynn**, of Johnson, died at her residence on 12 April 1911, aged 85. Mrs. Flynn was twice married, her first husband being W. James **Vause** who died near the close of the Civil War, leaving her the care and support of a family of small children. She was sometime afterwards married to L. Flynn, in 1867, who has been dead since 1899.

Mrs. Flynn was the mother of W. J. Vause of Johnson, R. W. Vause, of Wauchula, Florida, Mrs. D. W. Johnson, of Johnson, Mrs. Nathan Price of Gainesville, Florida, and Mrs. Jutta (Julia?) Crosby, late of Island Grove, Florida, all of whom were the children of her first marriage.

Mrs. Flynn was a native of Williamsburg, South Carolina, but had long been a resident of Florida, having moved here in 1857 with her husband, James Vause, before the Civil War. She had long been a member of the Johnson Presbyterian Church, being in fact a charter member of that church.

Grandma Flynn was in reality a pioneer in the State of her adoption and early endured the privations of frontier life, at a time when freighting and travel were largely done by ox team and when neighbors were not as accessible as to find frequent visiting with her friends an easy matter. She could tell many an interesting tale of early adventures and privations.
