Arthur Hodge, 21 years of age, and oldest son of Mr. and Mrs. H. S. Hodge of this city, died last Saturday afternoon of tuberculosis. He had been in failing health for some time.

Young Hodge formerly worked at Stanton's machine shops, but one year ago last Christmas he had an attack of pneumonia which proved the starting point of his subsequent ill health and final death. Most of the time during the past year he has led an outdoor life and seemed to be holding his own, though subject to occasional hemorrhages.

On Sunday before his death he had an attack of these and was confined for several days, but the cool weather of last week apparently made him worse and he died on Saturday.

Arthur Hodge was a most promising young man, of Christian character and high purpose, and his death is a sad blow to his fond parents and other members of the family. He was a nephew of the Messrs. L., J. H. and W. A. Merryday.

The funeral occurred from the Presbyterian church, of which he was a member, on Sunday afternoon and was largely attended by sympathizing friends.
