## **Biographical Sketches**

### DAVID P. HANCOCK.

David P. Hancock was born and reared at Bostwick, in this County, and educated in its public schools. Everybody in the County knows him and when his neighbors and friends sent him to the County Seat to represent them and to help administer the affairs of the County, they made a wise selection, as has been proven by his re-election. Before he became County Commissioner he was the efficient Postmaster of Bostwick, which important office he filled acceptably for twelve years. He is a progressive farmer and successful stock raiser, and comes from a family who during the years past, and at the present time, do take an important part in the administration of County affairs.

### WILLIAM C. ALVERS.

William C. Alvers was born on Washington's Birthday in the year 1842, in an old fort in Alachua County, at a place which has since been named Fort Harley. When quite a young child he sustained the loss of his father. Together with his widowed mother (at the age of 13), they moved to Welaka, in this

County, where he remained until 1860. At this period he moved to Orange County, settling at Orlando. At the outbreak of the Civil War he joined Company I, 7th Florida Regiment, serving throughout the war with the exception of a short vacation the "Yankees" gave him at Rock Island prison for eighteen months, he being a prisoner of war. After the war and his release from Rock Island he returned to Welaka, remaining until twenty-three years ago, when he settled in Putnam County, at his present home in Sisco. Mr. Alvers has been a County Commissioner of this County for six years and was the Chairman of the Board. He is a jolly good fellow, a genial and courteous gentleman, a great lover of outdoor life, a mighty hunter and a prince among his fellows in the matter of entertaining his friends.

### EMRA B. PERRY.

Emra B. Perry was born in 1862, near old Fort Harley in Alachua County. When an infant, death claimed his father and at the age of six years his widowed mother took her two children and moved to Mt. Royal in this County; later on they moved to Marion County, but not being suited they returned to Alachua County, settling near Waldo. After residing there nearly two years Mr. Perry came again to Putnam County and took up his abode at Putnam Hall. The country around Melrose appealed to him, and he located about two miles south of the present town in 1872. He engaged in farming and fruit growing and has always taken an active interest in County politics. Four years ago he was elected County Commissioner and last fall was re-elected to serve the present term. His work on the Florahome drainage board, of which he is chairman, has been highly commended by the people in that district, and his actions on the Board of County Commissioners have given satisfaction, and met with public approval.

### T. M. WALDRON.

T. M. Waldron at the last election was chosen to represent his District on the Board of County Commissioners. He first saw the light of day at Scriven, Wayne County, Georgia, in 1878. He came to Putnam County about twenty years ago, but his residence was not permanent until 1900, when he located at East Palatka, where he is engaged in farming and is successful in his chosen avocation. This is his first political office and with the assistance and co-operation of his fellow Commissioners, he expects to do good work for the County.

#### J. H. MILLICAN.

J. H. Millican was born in North Carolina and came to Florida in 1897, residing at Waldo, in Alachua County, for about seven years. He received his education primarily in the public schools, but finished later at the Massey Business College in Jacksonville. He came to Putnam County in 1903, locating at Orange Mills, and engaged in the naval stores business. As a farmer he has proved successful, as a business man he has proved efficient and capable. At the last County election he was chosen to represent his District as County Commissioner, and upon the organization of the new board he was unanimously selected as Chairman. Mr. Millican is also assistant cashier of the State Bank of Palatka.

### HON. HENRY HUTCHINSON.

In Tallahassee on October 20, 1855. This was the announcement of his birth. For several years he remained in that quaint old city, from whence came many illustrious men and makers of Florida history, until he had received as good an education as possible in the private schools, after which he was sent to La-

fayette Institute in New York, to receive the final education which was to fit him for life's duties. While in New York his parents moved to Crescent City, where he joined them shortly after the Civil War. His father being engaged in horticulture, Henry joined him, but later on assumed control of the business. In 1891 he was elected to the Legislature. In 1908 he was chosen by the people of Putnam County as Clerk of the Circuit Court, and re-elected in 1912. In politics he is a Democrat, adhering closely to party lines and principles. Henry Hutchinson is a man that is optimistic to a great degree, and a man who looks only for the good in humanity. His deeds of kindness done without ostentation and hope of reward have endeared him in the hearts of his friends. As an official no fault can be found in the conduct of his office. He is a member in high standing in Masonic Order, K. P., and the Elks.

### HENRY HUTCHINSON, JR.

Henry Hutchinson, Jr., born in 1886, at Oakwood Grove near Crescent City. A Floridian in every sense of the word; a genial good fellow, who by hard work is making for himself an enviable reputation, both in political and social life.

For a season he was the efficient foreman for the Preston Manufacturing Co., which position he resigned to assume the duties of Chief Deputy Clerk of the Circuit Court.

On July 20, 1910, he was married to Miss Beatrice L. Hawkins. They have one child—a bright little fellow, whose picture can be found in this directory; his appellation is Henry III.

#### HENNIS PETERMANN.

Hennis Petermann—Everybody in Putnam County knows him; he was born in Palatka on August 20th, 1855; was educated mainly in private schools and received his final education at college in Suwanee, Tenn. During the Civil War he resided at Orange Springs. He has held a public office in the county since he became 21 years of age. Mr. Petermann is a gentleman of sterling character and at present holds the responsible position of Supervisor of Registration for both the County of Putnam and the city of Palatka.

### GEORGE F. BULLARD.

George F. Bullard was born in Twiggs County, Georgia, September 24, 1848. At the age of 16 he saw active service in the Confederate Army. He has been an assessor of taxes nearly all of his public career. Four years he served Telfair County, Ga., in that capacity. He came to Putnam County in 1879 and in 1897 was chosen assessor, which office he has filled for almost twenty years. His judgment in the assessment of lands and knowledge of values has created for him a reputation unsurpassed by any other official of the County.

### JOHN E. MARSHALL.

John E. Marshall, the present Justice of the Peace for the 8th district, was born in Boston, Mass., and came to Putnam County in 1878. He engaged in horticulture and was successful. Since 1880 he has been a servant of the public, having served as County Commissioner for two terms. He was admitted to the Bar in 1893, at which time he took up his residence in Palatka and practiced his profession. In 1909 he was elected Justice of the Peace, which office he now holds.

## Palatka

Palatka is 55 miles south of Jacksonville and the two cities are connected by the St. Johns River and two different railroad lines. In all Palatka has four separate railroads. Palatka is easy to reach, it being at the head of deep-water navigation on the St. Johns, to which steamers and sailing vessels come for products of our mills and factories. Only one other point in Florida equals Palatka in transportation facilities. It is the seat of justice of Putnam County, which has approximately 20,000 in population. Eighteen foreign countries are represented and nearly every state in the Union. There are 12 miles of vitrified brick streets in the city and about 20 miles of concrete sidewalks. As a residential city, Palatka has exceptional advantages: It is sanitary, with good sewerage, waterworks, electric and gas plants, ice factory, public library, well-stocked stores, churches and schools, There are no saloons and we claim the town is a good one in which to live. It is a law-abiding community. Noble trees shade its streets, and the city is attractive enough to cause scores of people prominent in various walks of life to make frequent and protracted visits. Our facilities to entertain visitors are better now than ever before and equal to any in the state. Palatka has good hotels, desirable apartments for light housekeeping, large rooming and boarding houses, and fine restaurants. Palatka's commercial advantages are many, every form of business is represented, with good stocks. Freight rates are lower by reason of water shipping facilities, and accordingly the cost of living is less. No heavy clothing and expensive fuel bills. Its important factories and mills, secure to the city a large payroll, making a uniform income the year round-with no seasons off.

Palatka is considered by men who travel and sell goods, to be one of the safe, solid and progressive cities of Florida. You can believe in Palatka, the city

### FIRST BAPTIST CHURCH.

First Baptist Church is one of the leading churches of the city. It is centrally located and its membership is a live one. Rev. P. Quintius Cason, its present pastor, came to the church about five years ago, and his work has been successful in every department.

Rev Cason is a Floridian; he was born in Alachua County and at an early age began teaching in the public schools of that county, and subsequently in four other counties in the State . He attended the University of Florida, after which he studied theology in the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary at Louisville, Ky., and today is among the leading divines of that denomination. ### ST. MONICA'S CATHOLIC CHURCH.

Away back in the fifties the mission of Palatka was attended by priests from St. Augustine and Jacksonville. The first church-a small frame building-was blessed and dedicated to God under the patronage of St. Monica on December 8th, A. D. 1858, by Rev. Edmond Aubril, authorized by Rt. Rev. Augustine Verol, Bishop of Danube in partibus infidelium, and Vicar Apostolic of Florida. Fr. Hamilton, pastor of Jacksonville, gave his services during '59-'60. Frs. Aubril, Chambon, Clavreul, etc., in '61.

The troubled days of civil strife came on, blighting all missionary effort.

From the close of the unfortunate struggle to '73, Frs. Clavreul, Spandonari and Hugon cheerfully endured severe hardships attending the mission.

On the 23d of February, '73, Fr. Gaboury was appointed first resident pastor, and Rev. W. A. Margison succeeded him in July, 1874. Fr. Felix Ghione followed in January 27, 1876.

The Rev. W. J. Kenny, now Bishop of the diocese of St. Augustine, was promoted from Jacksonville, where he was generally beloved, to the pastoral charge of St. Monica's Church, and labored earnestly and untiringly for the spiritual uplift of the scattered flock in Putnam and neighboring counties during the years 1881-84, being recalled to Jacksonville on the death of its pastor, and replaced by Fr. B. O'Reilly, who is still kindly remembered here.

In 1887 Fr. W. Walsh took charge, remaining until 1891.

Then, after a brilliant course in Margret College, Limerick, Ireland, and in the American College, Rome, Fr. John O'Brien came in 1892 to take up the work of his worthy predecessor. But a few short years after his arrival he saw his flock greatly reduced, owing to the terrible freeze of 1894-95, which wiped out the orange industry on which they mainly depended.

In spite of this calamity, he set to work to secure funds for a new church, as the old one was no longer safe. In response to his efforts a sum of money was soon on hand sufficient to warrant the beginning of operations; and on the 31st day of October, 1897, Rt. Rev. Bishop Moore blessed and laid the corner stone, and on May 4, 1899, he blessed the finished edifice.

In 1903, in recognition of his eminent services, Fr. O'Brien was promoted to the flourishing parish of St. Michael's, Fernandina, and was succeeded in these missions by Rev. P. Barry.

With the co-operation of the faithful under his charge and fellow citizens of every denomination, he has been able to pay off all debts on the building, so that today the people behold on the corner of Fourth and Oak streets a solid brick structure, whose grace-

ful spire, surmounted by the emblem of salvation, tells the tale of faith and self sacrifice.

To the small but hard-working band of ladies of this parish is due the greatest praise and most of the glory of this achievement.

Rev. P. Barry was succeeded by Rev. J. D. Laplante, C. S. V., October 1, 1913.

## THE PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH. Rev. J. W. Purcell, D. D., Pastor.

The first regular service of Presbyterians in Palatka was held the first Sabbath in November, 1855, by the Rev. Joseph M. Quarterman, who had been called from Mount Vernon, Ga., to take charge of this work. The formal organization of the church was effected February 16, 1856, by Rev. J. H. Myers, D. D., of St. Augustine, acting by authority of the Presbytery.

The church was organized with eight members, as follows: Judge Wm. A. Forward, Mrs. Mary A. Forward, Mrs. E. W. Quarterman, Mrs. A. W. Cassels, Mrs. Mary A. DeVaul, Mrs. Sarah J. Askew, Mrs. Frances Price and Miss Lydia J. Forward. During the first year six others were added, three of whom remain with us until now, namely, Mrs. Mary F. Benet, Mrs. Ruth M. Jeffries and Mrs. Eliza Gray.

The following have served as pastors: Rev. Joseph M. Quarterman, 1855-58; Rev. E. P. Frierson, part of 1859 as supply; Rev. E. P. Crane, 1859-63; various supplies, 1864-70; Rev. B. C. Robertson, 1871-72; Revs. Edward Wurtz, B. L. Baker, Henry Brown, and J. H. Myers, supplies 1872-77; Rev. E. H. Briggs, 1877-80; Rev. W. A. Hendrickson, 1880-82; Rev. Samuel T. Wilson, D. D., Rev. J. B. Dunn, D. D., Rev. Luther H. Wilson, supplies 1883-90; Rev. Wm. S. Wallace, 1890-95; Rev. T. C. Marshall, supply 1895-97; Rev. Thos. P. Hay, D. D., 1897-1903; Rev. L. Ross Lynn, 1903-09; Rev. J. W. Purcell, D. D., 1910.

The following have served as Elders: Wm. A. Forward, A. W. Cassells, F. P. Kelly, H. H. Forward, J. H. Mason, Calvin Gillis, W. F. Forward, S. C. Quarterman, J. T. Dunn, Wm. Ewing, A. T. Capen, J. W. McLaury, Wm. Thompson, C. C. Lancaster, W. G. Campbell, H. M. de Montmollin, C. J. Garrett, S. P. Hollinrake, S. J. Barstow, A. T. Anderson, and J. Walter Hilliard. The present Elders are Messrs. Barstow, de Montmollin, and Hilliard.

During the fifty-eight years of the church's history about 400 persons have been enrolled; the present membership is 150. The building is in good condition, there is no debt, and the equipment is all that is needed for a successful working church plant. All pews are free, and a warm greeting will be given all who worship here.

# ST. JAMES METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH, SOUTH.

It is not known just when the Methodist Church was organized in Palatka, but probably about 1850 and 1855.

The first church was a small frame building on the corner of Oak and 4th streets, where the present church stands. It was built a short while before 1860. The present church building was erected in 1885.

Since its organization nearly one thousand persons have united with this church. The present membership is 325.

Beginning with 1870 the following ministers have been pastors of the Palatka Methodist Church: J. W. Duncan, S. S. Moore, J. E. Dodd, H. E. Partridge, T. W. Thompkins, T. W. Moore, S. B. Armstead, W. O. Butler, S. Woodberry, W. Dunbar, J. B. Ley, F. R. Bridges, J. A. Castell, R. L. Honiker, A. E. Householder, J. P. Hilburn, H. N. Williams, W. E. H. Mabry, A. Woodward, E. J. Gates, J. F. Bell, H. Dutill and W. M. Poage. The church has bought the lot on the corner of Reid and 4th streets and built a splendid parsonage and hope soon to erect a handsome church to meet the possibilities of the Sunday school and congregation.

Rev. William M. Poage is the present pastor.

## MT. TABOR BAPTIST CHURCH.

Was organized Sept. 15, 1865. Rev. P. P. Bishop, Rev Jones and Rev. Samuel Small constituted the council that ordained Bros. Jackson Wright and Ned Hutchinson as the first deacons. In 1871 Rev. William Bell was ordained at Gainesville, Fla., and came to the church as its first regular pastor and continued as such for eighteen consecutive years. Following him came Rev. L. N. Robison, who preached successfully for seven years and succeeded in lifting the heavy

debt under which the church was laboring. He was succeeded by the Rev. Bell, who filled the pulpit for two years. In 1898 Rev. E. M. Brawley was chosen as pastor and served for sixteen months, when Rev. Bell was again called and led the flock for another two years. In 1902 Rev. F. W. Wells came and presided as pastor until his decease in the year 1912. Rev. A. C. Williams served a year; then came an interval in the affairs of the church because of building a new edifice, during which time the church was without a regular pastor.

The present pastor, Rev. D. F. Thompson, is a man of culture and is now the respected pastor of a membership of about 450. The Rev. Bell is still a member of Mt. Tabor and is not only one of its most earnest and influential workers, but is looked upon as one of the fathers in Israel.

#### CALVARY BAPTIST CHURCH.

Calvary Baptist Church is located on the corner of 10th and Madison streets and was organized August 20, 1888, by Rev. Dr. W. A. Wilkerson, Rev. L. N. Robinson and Rev. W. M. Bell. Reuben Reed and Samuel Brown were ordained as deacons of the church. Rev. John Brown was called to the pastorate and remained two years, during which time many additions to the church were had. Rev. R. H. Griffin, of Gainesville, succeeded Rev. Brown and remained about one and one-half year. The church grew very materially during his ministration, after which it was without a pastor for nearly a year, but services were continued regularly. In 1894 Rev. L. W. Washington, of Gainesville, was called and accepted the pastorate, but remained only a few months, returning to Gainesville. Rev. John Brown again ministered to the church until March, 1895, when Rev. T. A. Roberts, of Albany, Ga., came and has remained as pastor until the present time. 

Rev. Roberts was born in Albany, Ga., was educated in the public schools of that city and later studied theology under Dr. McClendon at Jacksonville, Fla., and was ordained in that city in 1894. He accepted a call to St. Marks Baptist Church at Middleburg, Fla., and remained there for two years. Coming to Palatka and becoming the pastor of Calvary Church he has labored among his people until Calvary Church is known throughout the State. Its membership is about 200. Seats are free and the officers extend a hearty welcome to all who accept the invitation to worship with them.

## EMANUEL M. E. CHURCH.

This handsome church is located at Main and N 7th. It is one of the Methodist Churches that notwithstanding trial and adversity has forged ahead until it is now recognized as one of the leading churches in the Methodist Conference. It was organized in 1885 and rebuilt in 1912. At its organization there were nine members. Rev. Squire Jackson was its first pastor. He served for two years, followed by Rev. G. A. Roberts; following him came Rev. W. Suawn.

Fortunately for Emanuel Church it has had the best of preachers assigned them. The following ministers have served the church: A. Solomon, D. E. Jacob, Thos. Holsondorf, A. S. J. Allen, L. J. Littles, S. J. McCray, O. V. Jackson, Scot Bartley, T. M. Spicer, S. P. Pratt, W. T. Collier, J. M. Trammell, O. C. Collins, W. M. Harley and I. C. Manus.

The present pastor, Rev. Thomas Eugene DeBose, is now completing his fifth year, and has had a successful ministry. The church, under his management and leadership has prospered; he planned the new church and by persistent effort, with friendly aid, succeeded in building the handsome church. It is modern, well appointed and has a property value of \$10,000.

### MT. VERNON PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH Rev. Geo. F. Ellison, A. M., Pastor.

The church was organized in 1890, by the East Florida Presbytery, and was then known as the Second Presbyterian Church of Palatka. Its first pastor was Rev. Mr. McLain, who in conjunction with James L. Capers, James Adams, William Alston, P. W. Joseph and J. W. Echelberger, trustees, secured the land where the present handsome edifice now stands. In 1896 an application was made to the East Florida Presbytery to change the name of the church, which was granted. From the year 1895 to 1901, Rev. Harold C. Ugganis was pastor of the church. From 1902 to 1907 Rev. W. F. Kennedy carried forward the work of both church and school. From 1908 to 1912 Rev. Franklin Gregg was a faithful supply. In January, 1912, the present pastor, Rev. Geo. T. Ellison, was called by the congregation, and since then the work of the church and school has been wonderfully blest, and its advance rapid.

The Elders of the church are: L. P. Thompson, L. L. Trapp, Thos. Smith. Deacons—A. Bligen, Chas. Spencer (deceased). Trustees—L. L. Trapp, G. A. Browning and A. Bligen.

A cordial invitation is extended to worship with this congregation—corner of 8th and Lemon streets.

# BETHEL AFRICAN METHODIST EPISCOPAL CHURCH.

Like most great institutions, it was organized under difficulties. The first meeting was held at the close of the year 1866. The first church house was at the corner of Hotel and Emmett streets. During 1904 and '05 the present site was selected and purchased and by 1912 the church, a beautiful structure, was erected. It has added very materially to the usefulness and influence of the denomination in Palatka. The present pastor, Rev. Carey, is a man of great force and personal magnetism, and has succeeded in drawing to him the workers of his congregation.

Improved Order of Red Men in Palatka was organized August 4, 1881. Its name was Seminole Tribe No. 3. For a time it struggled against many odds, such as death, sickness and disease, and finally succumbed temporarily. It was reorganized on February 17, 1892, taking the name of Okeehumkee Tribe No. 15. Since that time it has prospered wonderfully, both in number and finance and is noted throughout the state for having furnished seven great Sachems since its re-organization. The Wigwam is located in Transportation Row on North First street, is nicely furnished and fully equipped to carry out the work of the Tribe which in the past as well as present, has had the crack degree team of the Florida Hunting Grounds. The tribe has paid many dollars for sick, accident and funeral benefits and still has a goodly sum in its treasury. Its membership consists of 180 good men from all stations in life, ever ready to promulgate the purposes of the order. They meet every Monday night. To all visiting as well as resident Red Men, the usual welcome and hospitality of the tribe is extended.

Redwing Council No. 7, Degree of Pocahontas, was organized February 15, 1911, with a membership of 36. The council is composed of a live, wide-awake fraternity of ladies by whose unceasing efforts have doubled the membership. They are proud of their lodge and take great interest in their degree team, which has all the necessary accourtements and paraphernalia to impress a candidate that there is more than fun in the initiatory ceremony.

The council meets every Thursday night at Red Men's Hall. They also extend an earnest invitation to their visiting sisters of the order.

## The Board of Trade of "Our Town."

The Palatka Board of Trade has a membership of over 200 active business men and citizens, all thoroughly united:

To promote the utilization of local and tributary resources; to give thought and encouragement to changes that will make the city a more attractive, wholesome and healthful place in which to raise children—one in which the children will become diligent, useful and law-abiding citizens, ever ready to respond to public duty; a place where the manufacturer can find a proper site for his factory or mill, with efficient employes and necessary transportation facilities; a place where the workman can have the right kind of a home; a place in which every citizen will take more pride because of its increased cleanliness and beauty; and to fittingly advertise these facts and advantages to all the world.

The Board has large ground floor rooms at 114 South Second street, a half block from Lemon street, with auditorium for public meetings, a collection of goods made by the factories of the city, and of products of the farms, groves and gardens of Putnam county, and inspection is cordially invited.

Visitors will also find a plentiful supply of printed matter descriptive of the town, County and State, for free distribution and a display of maps and pictures well worth seeing.

Palatka is the seat of justice of Putnam County. The population of the city is about 6,500; of the county about

20,000 and 18 foreign countries and nearly every state in the Union is represented.

Putnam County contains 752 square miles with more than 100 miles of railways, equal in proportion to area perhaps with any other in the state. Through a combinaion of rail and water transportation facilities and consequent low freight rates, Palatka has become a manufacturing center of importance and this field of investment is a most inviting one.

The claim of the Board that Palatka is one of the best cities in Florida is not made in a boasting spirit. It is with pardonable pride that the people term it "Our Town."

Every community feels a pride in the possessions of certain features and advantages which it believes are distinctive of its own town. Town pride is the upbuilding of Florida, and is the best evidence that a people are active and prosperous, inviting inspection and welcoming newcomers.

Palatka possesses this town pride to a large degree, and the rapid building and progress made in the past two or three years are truly indicative of the kind of results which are obtained when citizens are fully awake to the advancement of their own community.

Palatka, linked inseparably with the progress and prosperity and fame of the St. Johns river region, is one of Florida's best assets. Primarily a steamer and railroad center it offers unusual transportation facilities, and is rapidly becoming a heavy shipping and transfer point, constantly attractive to new industries. When we get our municipal docks we will push to the front as the chief interior city of the state.

Yes, "Our Town" is growing. It is growing with Jacksonville, with Tampa, with Miami, with all the other cities and towns of the state. It will continue to grow, for we have the backbone of Florida citizenship to push and prosper a section which is naturally favored by Nature and which opens up the horn of plenty to all who come and intelligently apply themselves.

To any reader who is thinking of locating we say, "try us." In "Our Town" may be the opportunity, perhaps, for the very business in which you are engaged. You will be well taken care of while here, for we have hotel, boarding and rooming facilities equal to any in the state. We are sociable. We believe you will find a spirit of honesty, and hospitality, and hustle and business and intelligence and cheerfulness that will interest you.

Palatka has good schools. There is efficiency in every department. The course includes the primary and grammar grades and a high school curriculum by which students are prepared for college. There are also three schools under church auspices, Catholic, Episcopal and Presbyterian, also practical business college and a school of music. A helpful adjunct is a free public library and reading room open every afternoon and evening. There are good schools for the colored people.

No town of equal population in the south equals Palatka in miles of brick streets and concrete sidewalks, there being twelve miles of vitrified brick and hard surface pavements, and twenty miles of model sidewalks.

The town is particularly fortunate in the high character of its newspapers. There are seven printing offices, and two daily, four weekly and one monthly papers are issued. No other town in Florida or the South can equal "Our Town" in this respect.

"Our Town" has excellent hotels, boarding places, apartments for light housekeeping and rooming houses. The spacious Putnam Hotel can care for 400 guests, while the Kupperbusch, Saratoga, Arlington, Howell and others have accommodation for many guests. The New James' restaurant is one of the finest in the South.

The leading fraternal, benevolent, patriotic, religious and civic societies attest the social and kindly spirit of "Our Town." These include the Masons, from blue lodge to commandery, Eastern Star, Odd Fellows, Rebekahs, Knights of Pythias, Pythian Sisters, Elks, Red-Men, Woodmen, Moose, American Mechanics, U. D. of C., U. C. V., G. A. R., S. of V., V. A. of B. and G., Woman's Civic Club, Memorial Association, etc., while the churches have kindred societies for young folks. The colored people also have their various secret, religious and fraternal orders. There is no lack of chance to "jine" the kind of society one has most interest in. The Knights of Pythias own their Castle Hall, a property worth \$8,000, the finest in Florida, while the Masons are arranging to build a Temple, having their site, and a fund ample to begin construction. The Elks and the Woman's Club also own building lots.

In volume of freight traffic Palatka is the fourth city in Florida.

There is a fire department with motor equipment; since it was established it has become a source of pride to the city, and has measurably reduced the cost of fire insurance.

An efficient police department is provided and all property and citizens are so carefully protected that there has never been any serious loss, trouble or disturbance.

"Our Town" enjoys free delivery of mail and various rural mail routes run into the surrounding country.

Religion is represented in "Our Town" by leading church organizations:—Baptist, Catholic, Episcopal, Methodist, Presbyterian, etc., with attractive buildings, eloquent ministers, pipe organs and choirs with real singers and Sunday Schools with devoted teachers. Colored people, too, have good church structures and large congregations. Christian hospitality is a common trait of life in Palatka and strangers entering its churches are greeted by a hearty welcome, such as brings them back again.

An Athletic Association owns a large club house on the river bank and is supplied with much valuable apparatus. There may be larger club houses in the state, but none more attractively located. Good theatres are in evidence, and we have "movies" of course, and a brass band generously gives open air concerts every Saturday evening all the year round.

"Our Town" has two bridges across the St. Johns River, one of them being the only wagon bridge across that great stream.

Within a radius of thirty miles of "Our Town" is one of Florida's artesian well districts with pressure ample to send water 25 feet above the surface. This area has a remarkable underground water supply.

Palatka is encircled with a complete sewerage system, giving protection against unsanitary conditions and the spread of disease. Ours is one of the few cities in Florida with soft water. Our water works, two systems, supply ample quantity good water for all purposes.

Palatka at the head of deep navigation on the St. Johns river, with six steamer lines, has access to the sea and the world. This gives the city minimum freight rates. Sailing vessels are regularly seen in our harbor, being loaded with cargoes from our mills, destined for New York and other Atlantic Coast ports.

Palatka has four different railroad lines, the leading ones of the South, giving ready access to all parts of Florida and the country at large. These roads are as follows: The main line of the Atlantic Coast Line, with large transfer yards and a branch line and river docks. 












